Dear Parents / Carers,

Are you interested in understanding more about autism, ADHD, dyslexia, dyspraxia and dyscalculia? What does the term 'neurodiversity' mean to you?

"Many people in our community use neurodiversity as an umbrella term used to describe alternative thinking styles such as Dyslexia, DCD (Dyspraxia), Dyscalculia, Autism and ADHD. But regardless of labels, neurodiversity is about recognising those who think differently."

Running from the **18th to the 24th March**, "Neurodiversity Celebration Week is a worldwide initiative that challenges stereotypes and misconceptions about neurological differences. It aims to transform how neurodivergent individuals are perceived and supported ..." Throughout the week St. Mary's Priory will be learning more about what neurodiversity means and how we all have a different brain, making us all unique and wonderful. They will take part in lessons that will explore this area in more detail, ensuring that everyone has a clearer understanding of how we all think in a different way. Please continue and support these conversations at home with your children.


